- 9. C-9- Globalization & Society. This paper aims at brining about the meaning of globalization & its impact on Indian society.
- 10. C-10- Marriage, Family & Kinship. This core gives clear & adequate ideas about different types of marriage, Family & Kinship.
- 11. C-11- Research Methodology. This core introduces meaning of research, different types of research. Research Tools, analysis of research, ethical issues of research. A student can have clear idea about research for under graduate students.
- 12. C-12- Social Movement in India. This paper introduces different social movement in India for the understanding of the students.
- 13. C-13- Population & Society. This paper attempts to throw significant light on population, Demography etc. for the greater understanding of students.
- 14. C-14- Social Disorganization & Deviance. The students get adequate exposure to Social Disorganization & Deviance.
